#### Travel Arrangements for the Hyde Park Vigil:

Leave at approximately 9 AM from the church (this may need to be revised, so PLEASE check the newsletter again next week) [see Deacon Mark]

The Vigil is expected to finish sometime after 9 PM, so you should expect to be back in Cardiff sometime after midnight.

#### Travel Arrangements for the Beatification in Birmingham:

Cardiff (St Illtyds High School)

Depart at 3.30 AM from Saint Illtyds High School (please allow yourself plenty of time because the coach will LEAVE at 3.30).

Estimated time of arrival back in Cardiff - 5 PM

In both cases you are advised to bring something to sit on (either a rug or a folding chair) as well as plenty to eat and drink. **The cost will be £25** for either trip (includes travel and Pilgrim Pack).
